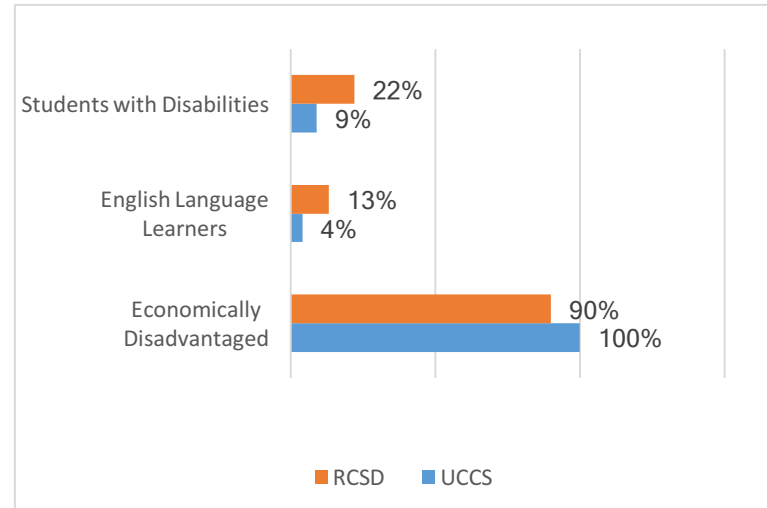

ENROLLMENT OVER TIME

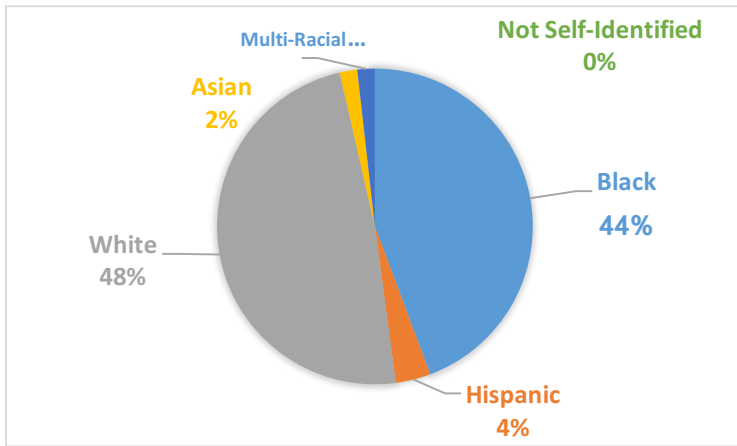
